

INFORMATION ON SECURITY AND DANGEROUS GOODS

All passengers must identify themselves with their **ID or passport** at the airport, following the instructions of the ground handling personnel.

Passengers must be subjected to a series of mandatory measures to prevent them from having access to restricted security zones with **prohibited and/or dangerous items**. These measures include a full inspection of their carry-on baggage and the refusal to carry it out will imply a denied boarding of the passenger. The list of prohibited items in the restricted areas of the airport and in the cabin of the aircraft, as well as the articles prohibited in the baggage destined to the hold of the aircraft, will be available at the check-in counters. Liquids, aerosols and gels in carry-on baggage should be housed in individual containers of 100 ml or less sealed in a single clear plastic bag of 1 liter maximum capacity that can be re-closed. Passengers must be provided with these bags before the start of the trip.

Regarding **Portable Electronic Devices (PED)**, passengers shall take into account that large PEDs should be carried in the passenger cabin whenever possible.

Should this not be possible (e.g. due to its size), the following actions shall be taken:

- PED shall be completely switched off and effectively protected from accidental activation: any application, alarm or pre-set configuration that may activate it shall be disabled or deactivated;
- PED shall be protected from the risk of accidental damage by applying suitable casing or by being placed in a rigid bag protected by adequate cushioning (e.g. clothing);
- PED shall not be carried in the same baggage together with flammable material (e.g. perfumes, aerosols, etc.);

Where carry-on bags are put in the hold (e.g. due to the lack of space) passengers are requested to remove from the bag any spare batteries, e-cigarettes, PED, etc. that might be carried within.
